

Director, Racial Equity and Human Rights

The Association of Ontario Midwives (AOM) is seeking a Director, Racial Equity and Human Rights during an exciting period of growth, challenge and opportunity. Reporting to the Executive Director, the Director, Racial Equity and Human Rights is responsible for leading racial equity and human rights work and operationalizing strategic objectives related to improving racial equity and human rights within the association and across the midwifery sector.

Specific Responsibilities:

- lead organizational change work to ensure programs, services and ways of doing business meet the needs of racialized midwives and/or midwives from equity-seeking communities
- lead racial equity and human rights education, including within the association, for membership and across the midwifery sector
- ensure development and on-going operation of committees, task forces and working groups as required, including supervision of work plan development, implementation and evaluation
- steer community engagement and consultation to engage with and learn from those directly impacted by racism and human rights-based discrimination
- liaise with external stakeholders and funders and supervise the drafting of reports for diverse audiences
- direct advocacy work and act as a representative of anti-racism and equity work through public speaking and presentations
- manage the creation of content for publication including on website, weekly digest and social media networks
- supervise and mentor staff to achieve objectives, deliverables and priorities
- advise the senior management team and management work including human resource management, budgeting, strategic planning, implementation evaluation and strategizing

- Relevant education and five years of experience in a leadership or management position
- Proven track record of leading racial equity and human rights organizational change work, including demonstrated understanding of anti-Black racism and intersectionality
- Demonstrated understanding of provincial health policy and the implications for racialized and equity-seeking communities in Ontario
- Experience interfacing with funders and government in an advocacy role
- Exemplary inter-personal and communication skills
- Able to manage multiple tasks, deadlines and demands with professionalism and proficiency
- Able to work in a fast paced and challenging environment

The AOM will prioritize qualified candidates who self-identify as Indigenous and/or racialized for the Director, Anti-Racism and Equity position.
