

Accepting Applications for a General Registrant

Midwives of Headwater Hills is situated in Orangeville and serves the surrounding communities of Shelburne, Caledon, Grand Valley, Mono and Bolton. Orangeville is a growing community with many city amenities and a friendly small-town atmosphere. There are plentiful opportunities for outdoor recreation and close proximity to major centres for entertainment and shopping.

Our practice opened in 2009 in response to strong community support for midwifery care. We hold privileges at Headwaters Health Care Centre in Orangeville, a level 1 hospital which handles approximately 800 births annually. We enjoy positive inter-professional relationships and are responsible for approximately 25% of the maternity care in the community. Headwaters Health Care Centre offers 24/7 obstetric, anaesthesia and pediatric coverage as well as in-house breastfeeding nurses and a supportive complement of RNs and RPNs. We maintain care for epidurals, however oxytocin is a transfer of care.

We are currently a practice of five general registrants working in a shared care model that provides one week on and one week off-call as well as 10 weeks vacation per year. We are looking for a full-time general registrant to pick-up the established caseload of an outgoing midwife. The anticipated start date is early 2018. There is flexibility in the duration of the position ranging from 6 months to the potential for the position to become permanent depending on caseload, practice needs and the right fit. We are most interested in meeting with interested general registrants to discuss possibilities for this position.

- dedicated to the promotion of home birth and informed choice
- innovative and enthusiastic with a good sense of humour and excellent communication skills
- interested in working to further develop excellent inter-professional relationships
