We are a well-established practice with deep roots in our community; Midwives of Muskoka is now in its 20th year of operation. We are a dynamic and growing practice with a large catchment area that extends from Orillia to Emsdale and everything in between. In Muskoka, we are on the traditional territory of the Anishnaabeg, which includes the Ojibwe, Odawa, and Potawatomi Nations, collectively known as the Three Fires Confederacy.

Our midwives hold privileges at 3 different hospital sites in addition to having a thriving culture of homebirth (30-40%) (although at the moment one of our L&D units is on long-term re-direct). We are a practice of 6 full-time midwives and are looking for someone to join our growing team. At Muskoka Algonquin Healthcare/Huntsville Hospital (level 1) we work to our full scope, managing oxytocin and epidurals, with excellent hospital relationships. At Orillia Soldiers Memorial Hospital (level 2), we manage epidurals and are currently transfer care for oxytocin and miso inductions.

We are seeking a midwife who feels passionate about our role as autonomous care providers and advocates; who reflects values of collaboration and respect, and who appreciates going out for breakfast after births.

Our group will have a caseload built for an incoming midwife and our mentorship includes having a midwife present with you for births until you feel competent and safe to practice independently. Midwives of Muskoka are also fortunate to have amazing admin and support staff and beautiful clinic space in a century home in the heart of downtown Bracebridge.

We welcome applications from midwives with varied personal and professional experience, including Indigenous midwives and others who are prepared to actively engage in reconciliation action with our practice and local communities.
