About the Work

The Midwife supports the implementation and management of the territorial midwifery program, ensuring the quality and consistency of culturally safe, relationship-based midwifery care that contributes to optimal maternal / child-health outcomes in the Northwest Territories. As a member of the Yellowknife midwifery team, this position will collaborate closely with the Territorial Manager, Midwifery and the Registered Midwives at regional practice sites to implement the Territorial Midwifery Program and to promote coordinated and consistent program operations and clinical service excellence.

The Midwife plays a leadership role in establishing new midwifery teams in Yellowknife with outreach services to the regions, while providing support to existing teams in Hay River and Fort Smith. The Midwife provides primary midwifery care in Yellowknife and other various sites in the Northwest Territories to support the capacity of the NWT midwifery workforce. The position will also support the Territorial Manager, Midwifery with recruitment, retention, and quality improvement initiatives to ensure the success and sustainability of the Territorial Midwifery Program.

This position is currently available in Yellowknife, Northwest Territories.



Typically this position requires a Bachelor's Degree in Midwifery (Health Sciences) or assessed through a Prior Learning and Experience Assessment (PLEA) program within a Canadian province, with a minimum of two (2) years of experience in delivering midwifery care as a primary care provider
